

All laws of the State of Texas pertaining to public conduct apply. Additionally, Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 327, sets forth expected standards of park use. A portion of the code is below to review, but there are additional portions that apply even if not listed below.

1. Vehicles parked or used off authorized roadways are prohibited. (36 CFR 327.2)
2. Swimming, wading, snorkeling or scuba diving at one's own risk is permitted, except at launching sites, designated mooring points and public docks, or other areas so designated by the District Commander. (36 CFR 327.5a)
3. Diving, jumping or swinging from trees, bridges or other structures (cliff s) which cross or are adjacent to project waters is prohibited. (36 CFR 327.5c)
4. Keep park grounds free of litter; deposit trash in receptacles provided. (36 CFR 327.9a)
5. Rock fire rings or ground fires are prohibited. Fires must be confined to grills. (36 CFR 327.10b)
6. Pets must be kept on a leash not longer than six feet in length, at all times. No pets allowed on designated beaches. Pets may not be left unattended. (36 CFR 327.11a)
7. Persons shall be responsible for proper removal and disposal of any waste produced by animals. (36 CFR 327.11b)
8. Visitors must obey all posted signs and restrictions. (36 CFR 327.12)
9. Radios or car stereos must be kept at a sound level that will not disturb other visitors. (36 CFR 327.12)
10. The possession of loaded firearms, ammunitions, loaded projectile firing devices, bows and arrows, crossbows, or other weapons is prohibited. (36 CFR 327.13a)
11. Possession of explosives or explosive devices of any kind, including fireworks or other pyrotechnics is prohibited. (36 CFR 327.13b)

12. Cutting trees or limbs is prohibited. Gathering of dead wood on the ground for a fire is permitted. (36 CFR 327.14b)
13. Abandonment of property is illegal. (36 CFR 327.15)


### Day Use Rules

1. NO Camping in day use parks.
2. Fires must stay in Grill or Fire ring.
3. You make a mess, YOU clean it up!
4. Minors not allowed without parent or guardian.
5. Open: April 1 - Sept 30
6. Hours: 8am – sunset time posted at gate.
7. Drive-Up Fees:
  - o **\$5 per vehicle** (no buses)
8. Walk-In or Bike-In Fees:
  - o **\$2 per person** Age 16 and older
  - \*15 and under do not pay fee
9. **Free** to Registered Campers in a USACE park.
10. Drive thru is **never** allowed.
11. Glass containers and PETS are NEVER permitted. You will be asked to leave and remove them if you bring glass or pets to this park area.
12. Trailers, RVs, Busses and other such are **NOT** allowed in this park and beach area.
13. Park capacity limits will be enforced. When the park fills up, no more guests will be allowed to drive into the park until enough park visitors have left to make space available. This decision is made by the Park Ranger on duty.
14. Swimming and diving off of cliffs or rock ledges is prohibited. Do not dive.
